The PMIU-BLEP (the Implementing Agency) indicated above invites your quotation for Procurement of plants, Land preparation, excavation of channels, Digging of pits, provision of sweet soil and manure, plantation and beating of failures etc. For the purposes of any resulting contract, the Implementing Agency or their named representative shall be the Purchaser.
2. You are invited to submit your formal quotation(s) for supply of plants, Land preparation, excavation of channels, digging of pits, provision of sweet soil and manure, plantation and beating of failures etc. for Baluchistan Livelihood and Entrepreneurship Project (BLEP) – (P159292), as per specifications mentioned in Section-III. You can quote for the categories/ items under this Invitation. Dealer/ suppliers must quote for all items in this RFQ. Quotations will be evaluated and contract will be awarded to the technically responsive suppliers / dealer offering lowest quoted amount.
3. Your quotation(s) must be sealed, on firm / company's letterhead and marked as "Quotation for Supply of plants, Land preparation, excavation of channels, Digging of pits, provision of sweet soil and manure, plantation and beating of failures etc." and addressed to the Head of the Project, Balochistan Livelihood and Entrepreneurship Project (BLEP) – (P159292), as per following address: H # 450-5/9 Tajik Abad Killi Shabo, Quetta.
4. Your quotation should be accompanied by adequate technical documentation complete in all aspects, previous such kind of supply orders, company profile and catalogue(s) and other printed material or pertinent information for each item quoted.
5. The deadline for receipt of your quotation(s) by the Purchaser at the address indicated in Paragraph-3 is on or before **11:00 AM (PST) on November 24th, 2022**. Your quotation(s) should be submitted as per the instructions contained in the RFQ. The received quotations will be opened on the closing date and time as mentioned above. Late Quotations will not be accepted and shall be rejected.

The prices should be quoted in Pak Rupees and should be inclusive of all applicable taxes / stamp duty and transportation charges prevailing in Baluchistan Province and other levies payable by the supplier under the contract till the final/ named place of destination.

6. Offers determined to be substantially responsive to the technical specifications will be evaluated by comparison of their rates, in addition to the eligibility and qualification requirements outlined in the Section-II of this RFQ Document.
7. The award will be made to the firm offering the lowest evaluated rates that best meets the required standards/ specifications of technical capabilities along with complying/ providing all the requisite information and documentation.
8. Your quotation(s) shall be valid for a period of **45 Days** from the date for receipt of quotation(s) indicated in Paragraph 5 above.

SECTION-II

Instructions for Preparing Quotations

- 1. Scope of Procurement:** Invites formal quotations for Supply of plants, Land preparation, excavation of channels, Digging of pits, provision of sweet soil and manure, plantation and beating of failures etc in two (02) Districts (District Killa Saifullah & District Noshki) as described in the Technical Specifications as mentioned in Section-III.

The successful supplier will be expected to complete the delivery of plants, Land preparation, excavation of channels, Digging of pits, provision of sweet soil and manure, plantation and beating of failures etc. within due time.

- 2. Eligibility to Quote:**

- a. Submit only one Quotation, for all items by the registered firm. Joint Venture firm must be registered in FBR as a joint venture and all partners shall be jointly and severally liable for the execution of the Contract.

- 3. Qualification of the Suppliers:**

To qualify for award of Contract, a Suppliers must meet the following Qualifying Criteria:

- Firm must be registered in FBR as an active filer.
- Valid registration with Baluchistan Revenue Authority must be required within 15 days after award of contract.
- Must have relevant working experience of at least three (03) years.
(Copies of contract / letter of award / work order / completion certificates or reference letter from the clients stating scope of services and deliverables) of all relevant projects for last 03 years.
- Firm must have at least average annual turnover of PKR 20 million for the last three years.
(Bank statement / credit facility or audited financial statement must be provided for last three years)
- Goods shall be supplied strictly in accordance with the required specifications.

- 4. Terms and Conditions:**

- Suppliers / dealers are encouraged to quote for all items, partial quotation shall not be accepted.
- Validity of quotations must not be less than **45 Days** from the date of receiving / opening.
- Conditional quotations will not be acceptable.
- Suppliers must quote all items as required in this RFQ, quotations with partial / incomplete quantities shall be rejected.
- Payment shall be made within 30 days against invoice & sales tax invoice.
- Quotation amount should be in Pak Rupees.
- Supplier / dealer are requested to give their best and final prices as no negotiation are expected / allowed.
- Quantity can be increased/decreased by 15% of Contract amount.
- Quotation must be submitted on dealer/ firm's letterhead (signed & stamped)
- All applicable taxes shall be deducted according to government rules.
- Incomplete/conditional or overwritten quotations shall not be considered.

- Items / goods must be supplied / established at two (02) districts of Baluchistan as mentioned in delivery schedule.
- Preference may be given to offeror with minimum delivery time e.g. if the quoted price of two offerors is same, then preference shall be for the supplier providing minimum delivery time except force majeure.
- The Quotations shall be having DDP rates i.e. including all charges.
- The rates should be inclusive of delivery of items / goods as per delivery schedule.
- Supplier / dealer has to pay all **taxes and stamp duty** as per the law of Baluchistan Government.

Attachment A to the Conditions of Contract

Fraud and Corruption

(Text in this Appendix shall not be modified)

1. Purpose

1.1 The Bank's Anti-Corruption Guidelines and this annex apply with respect to procurement under Bank Investment Project Financing operations.

2. Requirements

2.1 The Bank requires that Borrowers (including beneficiaries of Bank financing); bidders (applicants/proposers), consultants, contractors and suppliers; any sub-contractors, sub-consultants, service providers or suppliers; any agents (whether declared or not); and any of their personnel, observe the highest standard of ethics during the procurement process, selection and contract execution of Bank-financed contracts, and refrain from Fraud and Corruption.

2.2 To this end, the Bank:

- a. Defines, for the purposes of this provision, the terms set forth below as follows:
 - i. "corrupt practice" is the offering, giving, receiving, or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of anything of value to influence improperly the actions of another party;
 - ii. "fraudulent practice" is any act or omission, including misrepresentation, that knowingly or recklessly misleads, or attempts to mislead, a party to obtain financial or other benefit or to avoid an obligation;
 - iii. "collusive practice" is an arrangement between two or more parties designed to achieve an improper purpose, including to influence improperly the actions of another party;
 - iv. "coercive practice" is impairing or harming, or threatening to impair or harm, directly or indirectly, any party or the property of the party to influence improperly the actions of a party;
 - v. "obstructive practice" is:
 - (a) deliberately destroying, falsifying, altering, or concealing of evidence material to the investigation or making false statements to investigators in order to materially impede a Bank investigation into allegations of a corrupt, fraudulent, coercive, or collusive practice; and/or threatening, harassing, or intimidating any party to prevent it from disclosing its knowledge of matters relevant to the investigation or from pursuing the investigation; or
 - (b) acts intended to materially impede the exercise of the Bank's inspection and audit rights provided for under paragraph 2.2 e. below.

- b. Rejects a proposal for award if the Bank determines that the firm or individual recommended for award, any of its personnel, or its agents, or its sub-consultants, sub-contractors, service providers, suppliers and/ or their employees, has, directly or indirectly, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, or obstructive practices in competing for the contract in question;
- c. In addition to the legal remedies set out in the relevant Legal Agreement, may take other appropriate actions, including declaring mis procurement, if the Bank determines at any time that representatives of the Borrower or of a recipient of any part of the proceeds of the loan engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, or obstructive practices during the procurement process, selection and/or execution of the contract in question, without the Borrower having taken timely and appropriate action satisfactory to the Bank to address such practices when they occur, including by failing to inform the Bank in a timely manner at the time they knew of the practices;
- d. Pursuant to the Bank's Anti- Corruption Guidelines and in accordance with the Bank's prevailing sanctions policies and procedures, may sanction a firm or individual, either indefinitely or for a stated period of time, including by publicly declaring such firm or individual ineligible (i) to be awarded or otherwise benefit from a Bank-financed contract, financially or in any other manner;¹ (ii) to be a nominated² sub-contractor, consultant, dealer or supplier, or service provider of an otherwise eligible firm being awarded a Bank-financed contract; and (iii) to receive the proceeds of any loan made by the Bank or otherwise to participate further in the preparation or implementation of any Bank-financed project;
- e. Requires that a clause be included in bidding/request for proposals documents and in contracts financed by a Bank loan, requiring (i) bidders (applicants/proposers), consultants, contractors, and suppliers, and their sub-contractors, sub-consultants, service providers, suppliers, agents personnel, permit the Bank to inspect³ all accounts, records and other documents relating to the procurement process, selection and/or contract execution, and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the Bank.

¹ For the avoidance of doubt, a sanctioned party's ineligibility to be awarded a contract shall include, without limitation, (i) applying for pre-qualification, expressing interest in a consultancy, and bidding, either directly or as a nominated sub-contractor, nominated consultant, nominated dealer or supplier, or nominated service provider, in respect of such contract, and (ii) entering into an addendum or amendment introducing a material modification to any existing contract.

² A nominated sub-contractor, nominated consultant, nominated dealer or supplier, or nominated service provider (different names are used depending on the particular bidding document) is one which has been: (i) included by the bidder in its pre-qualification application or bid because it brings specific and critical experience and know-how that allow the bidder to meet the qualification requirements for the particular bid; or (ii) appointed by the Borrower.

³ Inspections in this context usually are investigative (i.e., forensic) in nature. They involve fact-finding activities undertaken by the Bank or persons appointed by the Bank to address specific matters related to investigations/audits, such as evaluating the veracity of an allegation of possible Fraud and Corruption, through the appropriate mechanisms. Such activity includes but is not limited to: accessing and examining a firm's or individual's financial records and information, and making copies thereof as relevant; accessing and examining any other documents, data and information (whether in hard copy or electronic format) deemed relevant for the investigation/audit, and making copies thereof as relevant; interviewing staff and other relevant individuals; performing physical inspections and site visits; and obtaining third party verification of information.
